


Achieved over 5,000 social media engagements.

Triggered over 3,000 visits to the campaign web pages.

Encouraged over 400 letters to be sent to MPs, which led to 200 MPs actively raising the issue with Government Ministers.

Secured the support of a core group of 25 highly active cross-party parliamentary champions.

Directly brought the issue to the attention of then Prime Minister, Boris Johnson, to the extent that a photo of a SAL artefact was seen on display in No. 10







A further 47 pieces of media coverage in national and specialist titles, including *The Observer, Evening Standard, The Telegraph, BBC, Research Professional, The Critic,* and *Museums Journal.*

Letter to the Editor of *The Telegraph* signed by 67 influencers including parliamentarians, Jools Holland OBE, Lloyd Grossman CBE, university professors and many more.

Achieved over 10,000 social media engagements and triggered over 40,000 visits to campaign web pages.


Encouraged over 620 letters to be sent to MPs and secured responses to 22 Parliamentary Questions.


